Exacto Knife CS:

- Cut on a cutting board—not on the table. Don't try to cut in mid-air!
- Don't run with knives (duh)
- Keep the exacto pointed at the ground while transporting it
- Keep the blade clean—don't try to spread glue with it
- Knives may NOT leave the classroom!!
- Make sure blade is tightened
- Never use as a hammer!

Don't Use the Knife to Spread Glue:



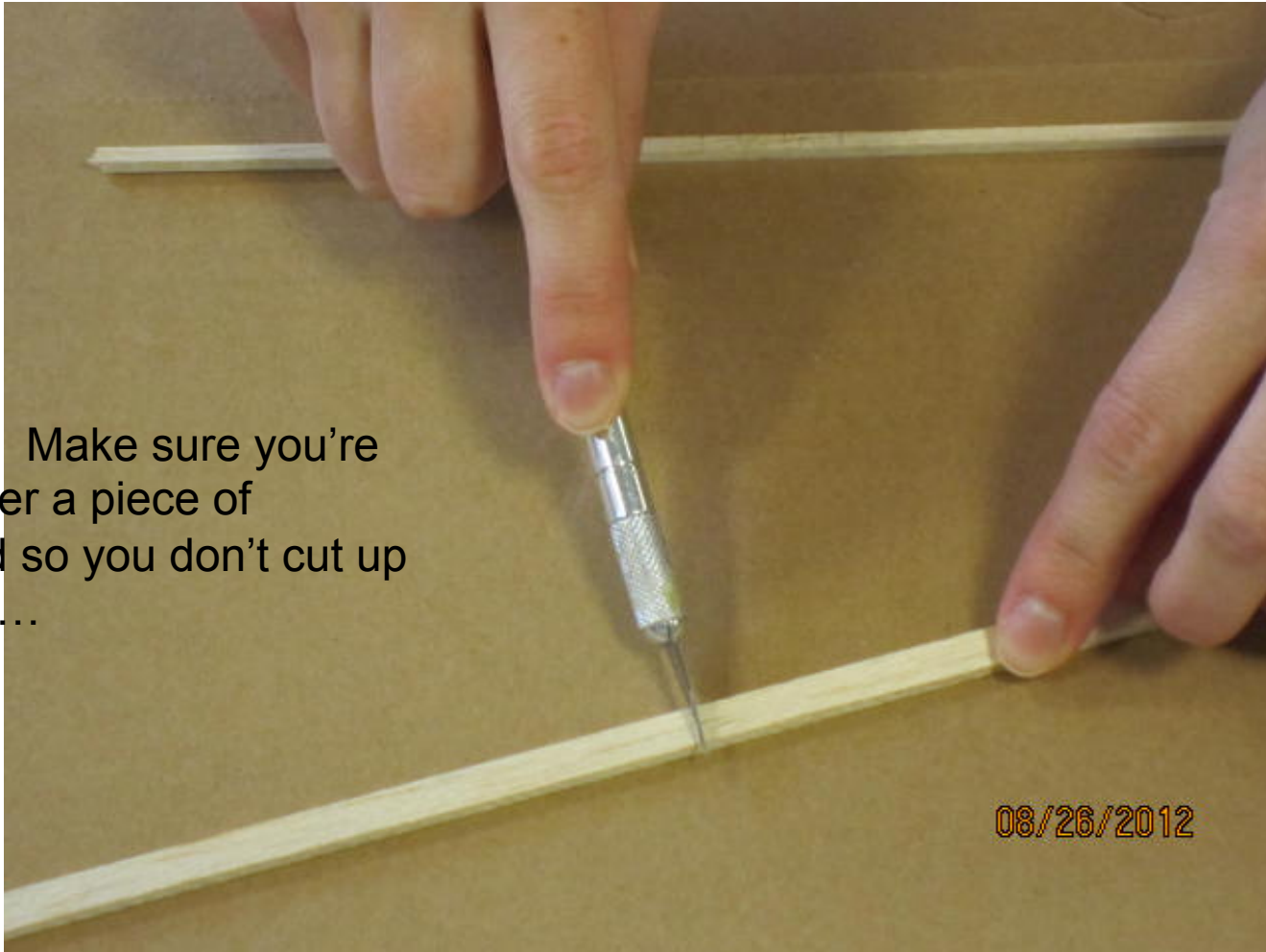
What's wrong with this picture?



Make sure the blades are still on before you return your knife!!

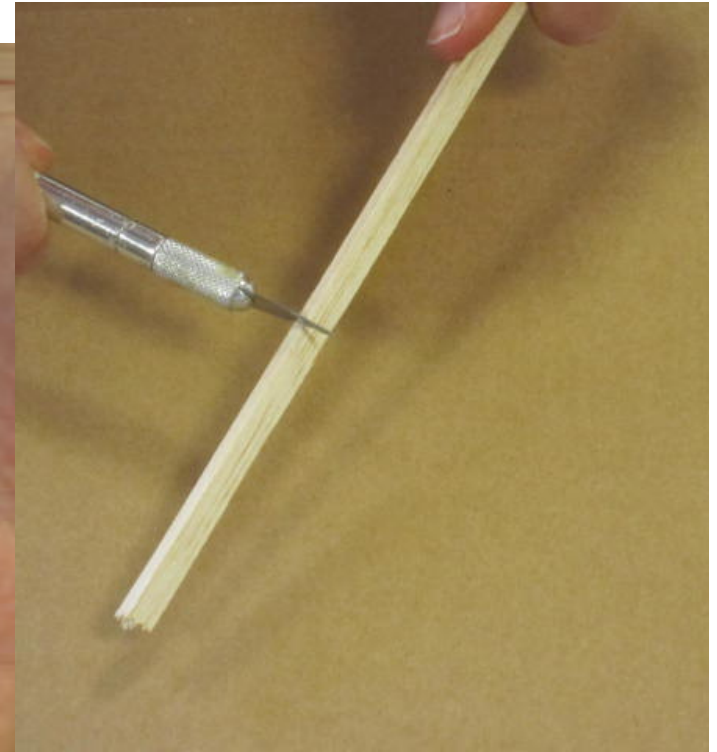
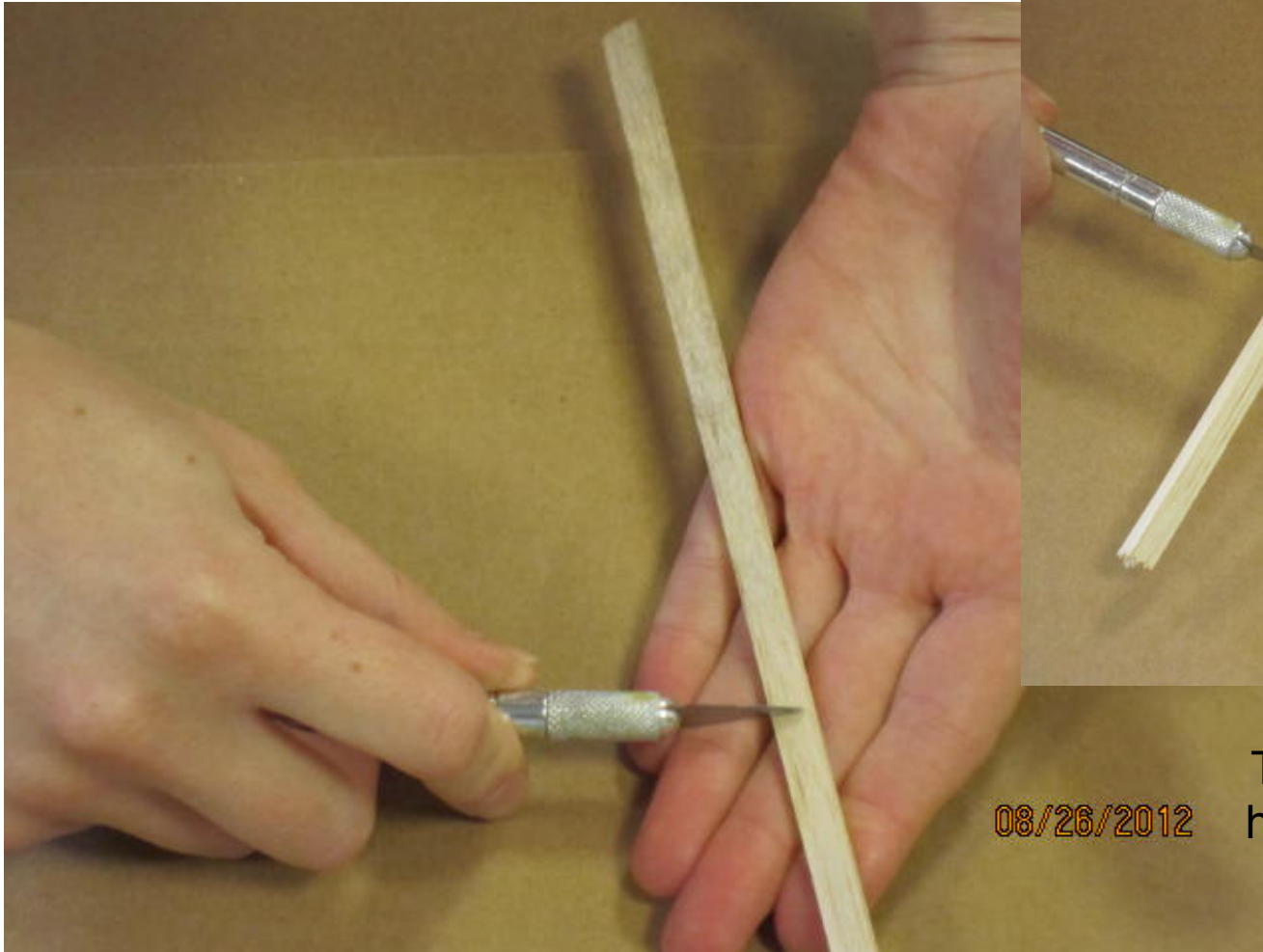

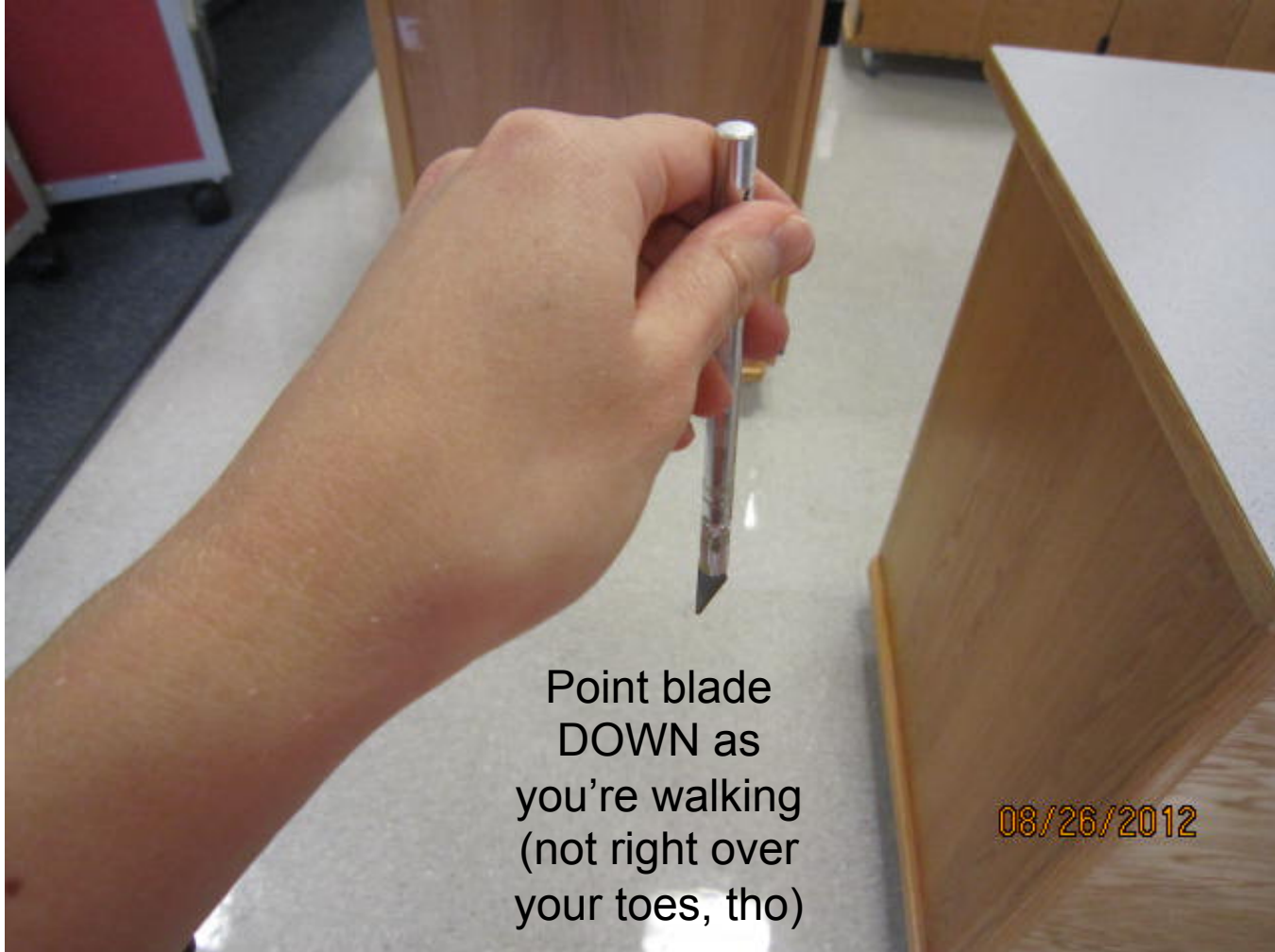

Lip Balm in the Foods Lab



We make lip balm. You put ingredients in a jar and nuke it in the microwave. When it comes out, it will be HOT. Handle with not 1, but TWO hot pads (pretend there's a 2nd hot pad in the picture).

A Few Lip Balm Lab Tips:

- Lip balm is made of grease and fats and oils. It doesn't come out of clothes completely!! So try not to spill, especially on yourself or your classmates.
- Before working in the foods lab, wash your hands. Often. If you pick your nose, you'd better wash your hands right after!!
- NEVER handle ingredients with your bare hands, even if you just washed them. Use the tools provided—scoops, tea/tablespoons, spoons, etc.

Internet Common Sense:

- Stay off of “bad” websites. You know better.
- Be careful what you search for on Google Images—sometimes, no matter what precautions you take, something bad will pop up. Just close the window and move on.
- If you use pictures or info from the Internet in an assignment, always write down the sources!
- We can use copyrighted stuff in the classroom thanks to Fair Use. Just don't take a project with copyrighted material in it and try to make money off it.

COPYRIGHT

- The exclusive legal right, given to an originator or an assignee to print, publish, perform, film, or record literary, artistic, or musical material, and to authorize others to do the same
- If you take someone's work and use it without permission—there's a giant fine for people who do this!!!
- Fair Use Act—We can use images from the Internet in the classroom for educational purposes. But it HAS to stay in the classroom!
